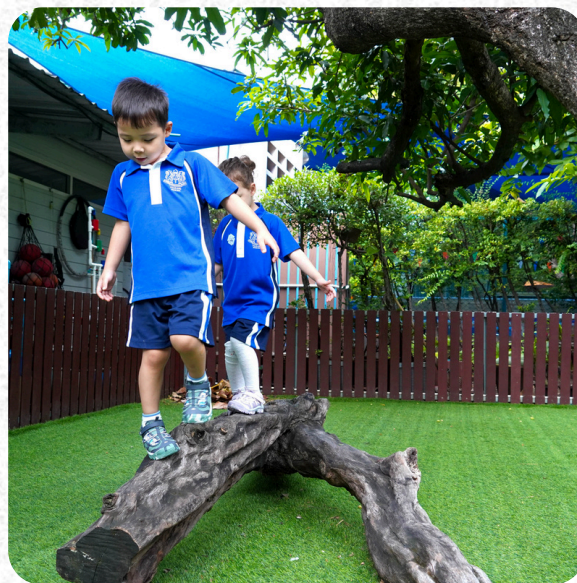

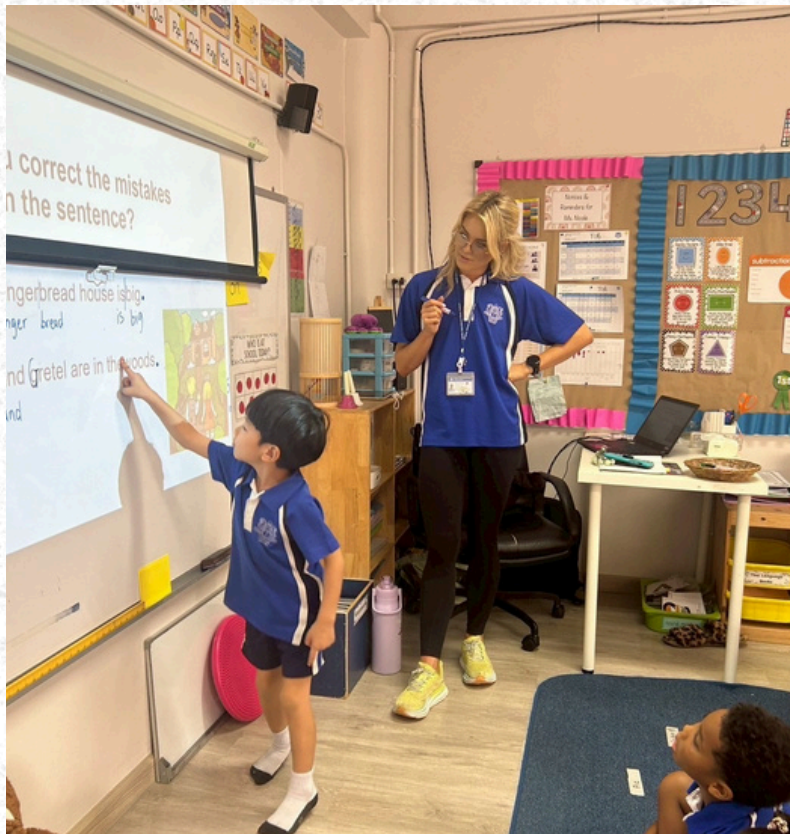
# FIRST SCHOOL

## Literacy in Year 1A

What a wonderful week we've had in Year 1A! Our young writers have been hard at work building their super sentence skills - and having lots of fun along the way!

### YEAR 1A – LITERACY

We started off the week with some exciting picture prompts that got everyone talking. The students enjoyed coming up with creative sentences together, practising how to share their ideas clearly and confidently. We've been focusing on what makes a sentence truly shine - like using capital letters, full stops, and neat finger spaces. The children especially loved becoming "Sentence Fixers," spotting and correcting jumbled-up sentences like true grammar detectives!

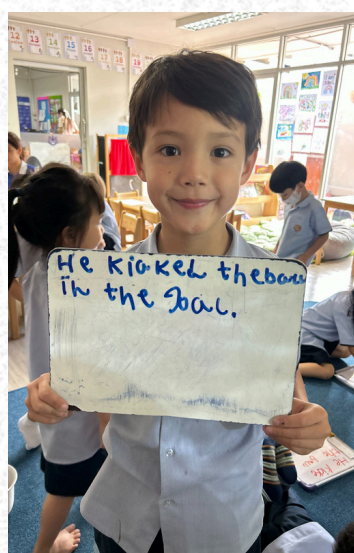

# SCIENCE – FORCES IN ACTION!

In Y5B, we have been exploring the forces around us by investigating air resistance! First, we explored how air resistance acts on falling objects, demonstrating how factors like shape, size and mass can affect the way they fall. Next, we returned to class to discuss how this scientific concept can be applied and utilised in real-life contexts, such as cycling teams and plane designs.

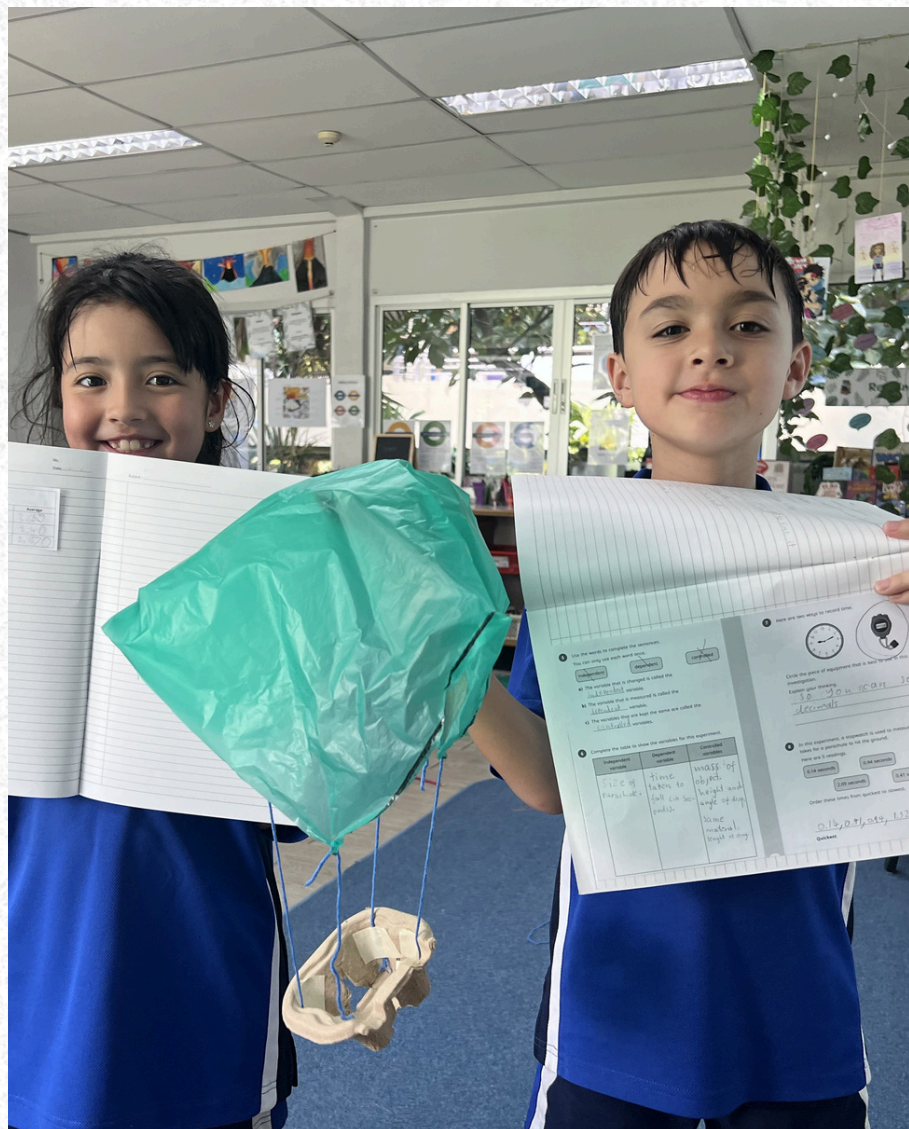

Then, we were ready to further investigate air resistance by using parachutes! Our super Primary Scientists worked in teams to plan and conduct fair tests by choosing and controlling their variables. After engineering three different sizes of parachute, the teams ventured outside to our drop zone to find out how this affected the fall time, recording their data accurately and looking for patterns in their results. The investigation not only helped us understand how air resistance works but also provided 5B with an opportunity to apply skills in teamwork, problem solving, and scientific enquiry.

## YEAR 9

Students will then create a specification of their game and begin design ideas that will lead to the final production of the board, question cards and rules for the game. There will also be the opportunity for students to use the CAD program Tinkercad to create their different player pieces, dice and even a trophy, which will then be printed out on our 3D printer.

All of these features will assist in creating a professional looking one of a kind board game that you can't buy in the shops.

In ADT, Year 9 have started the research for their exciting new board game project. They have created mood boards based on games, themes and features that they are interested in and also analysed existing products, not only board games you can buy but also games that previous Year 9 students have completed too.

This analysis covered the key main aspects summarized as ACCESS FM, this includes the following; aesthetics, cost, customer, environment, size, safety, function and materials. Reviewing these areas of each game allows the students to decide what are the good and bad features of a game and how they can implement or avoid them when designing their own board game.

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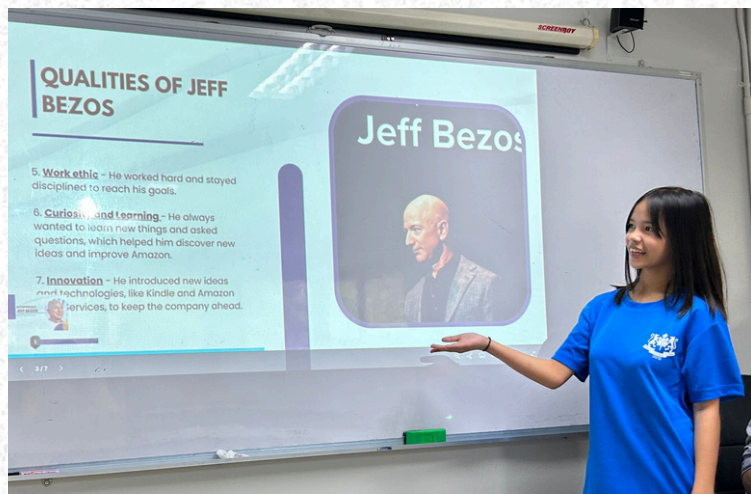
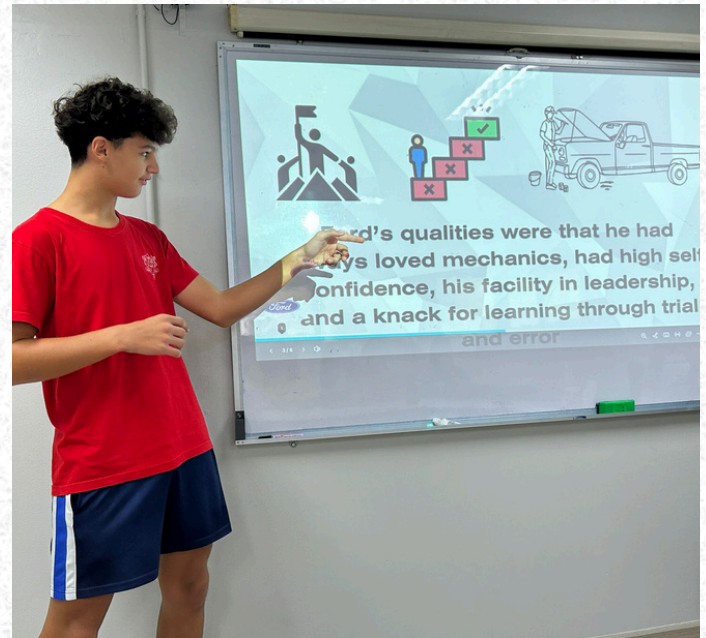

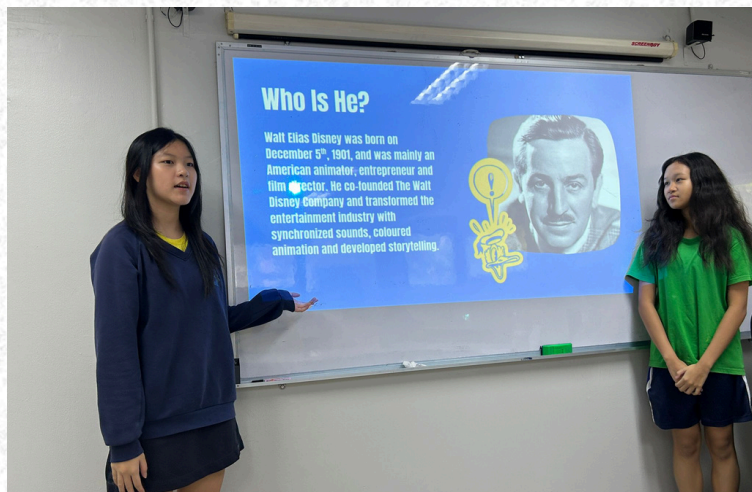
## YEAR 10

It is an exciting time in Year 10 Business. As a teacher, this class has always held a special place for me. By Year 10, students have already built strong foundations in subjects such as Mathematics, English, and Science. However, Business Studies offers them something different: a fresh syllabus that opens their eyes to new concepts, practical skills, and real-world applications. For many, it feels like they are stepping into a subject that is both relevant to their future and highly engaging.



## BUSINESS CLASS

At the moment, our focus has been on the characteristics of successful entrepreneurs. Together, we explored qualities such as risk-taking, self-confidence, adaptability, and leadership. Students discussed why these traits are so vital, not only for entrepreneurs but also for anyone seeking success in life. This unit has sparked lively debates and encouraged students to reflect on how these qualities can apply to their own personal development.





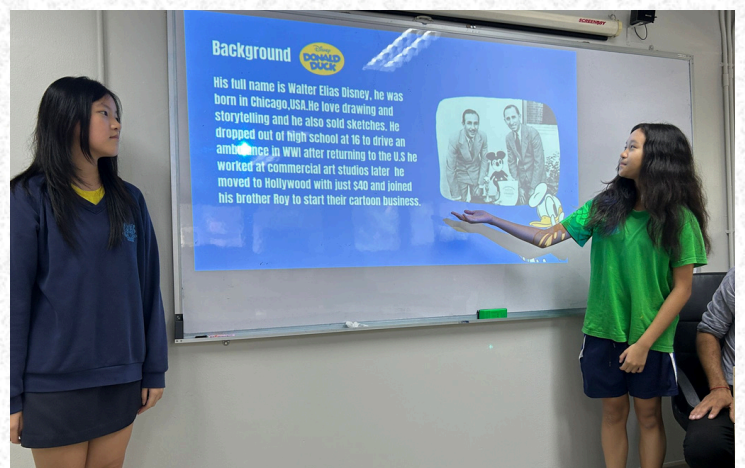

## YEAR 10 – BUSINESS CLASS

One of the highlights of the unit so far was a group presentation by Daniel, Nelson, and Jeffrey. They chose to research Henry Ford, the innovative mind behind the mass production of automobiles. The group explained how Ford's vision, determination, and leadership perfectly matched the entrepreneurial characteristics we had studied. Their presentation was engaging, informative, and showed real depth of understanding.



Overall, the Year 10 Business group is already proving to be a dynamic and hardworking class. They take diligent notes, ask thoughtful questions, and participate actively in discussions. With this level of dedication, I am confident they will continue to grow into capable, motivated, and successful learners.





# YEAR 13 – BIOLOGY



Year 13 A Level Biology students have been learning about respiration in cells, and in particular the production of ATP, a chemical that is an even better source of energy in living organisms than the simple sugar, glucose. Respiration occurs in four sequential stages, either with or without oxygen being present. In the first stage, called glycolysis, glucose is broken down into a smaller molecule called pyruvate, which produces a small amount of ATP (energy).

## SECONDARY SCHOOL

This process can be tracked using a chemical indicator called methylene blue, which changes from blue to colourless during glycolysis. By carrying out the experiment using respiring yeast cells in solution at three different temperatures; 30C, 40C and 50C, the rate of yeast's respiration can be measured by timing how long it takes for the blue colour to disappear. As expected, 50C was the fastest, then 40C and finally 30C. Year 13 collaborated together throughout this experiment, being given only a limited method, and achieving meaningful results that supported their theoretical understanding.





# PRIMARY MANDARIN



In Mandarin class, the students joyfully learned a Chinese song titled “Sawaddee Ni hao!” to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between China and Thailand.

This meaningful activity helped deepen their understanding of the close and long-standing friendship shared by the two nations. In addition to singing, the students also practiced writing the Chinese phrase:

“中泰一家亲，友谊万年长。”

จีนและไทยเป็นครอบครัวเดียวกันและมีมิตรภาพของเราจะคงอยู่ตลอดไป

which translates to “China and Thailand are one family, and may our friendship last forever.”
