

FIRST SCHOOL

Teaching Thai language at the Year 1 level serves as a crucial foundation for the development of language skills. Learning about Thai consonants is one of the first and most essential steps in acquiring Thai literacy, as it directly affects students' future reading and writing abilities. However, learners at this developmental stage often have short attention spans and tend to learn best through play. Therefore, incorporating games into the learning process is an effective approach to stimulate interest and enhance meaningful learning.

The results of these game-based activities indicated that students greatly enjoyed the learning process, demonstrated noticeable improvement in their ability to recognize and pronounce Thai consonants, and exhibited increased confidence and a more positive attitude toward learning Thai language.

In conclusion, using games as an instructional strategy is proven to be an effective method for enhancing the learning of Thai consonants among Year 1 students. Moreover, this approach is flexible and adaptable for use in a variety of educational contexts.

With so much enthusiasm already shining through, we're confident this production will capture the warmth and magic of the season.








COURTROOM DRAMA IN 7A ENGLISH
